Dr. Hugh C. Russell brings more than 40 years of community development experience that spans the globe, in addition to advanced degrees and research in social psychology and communications. Currently he focuses on mobilizing communities to more effectively deal with their individual, social and criminal justice issues. Russell is a specialist in mobilizing people to take more responsibility for reducing and preventing crime, and achieving justice in their neighborhoods. He consults police services on how officers can motivate community members to be more proactive and effective in increasing community safety, security and wellbeing. For over 25 years Russell has

worked closely with police, other emergency services and military forces in

Canada and the United States. In Ontario he is principal architect behind a strategy police have adopted province-wide, to stimulate residents in high-risk neighborhoods to take more responsibility for crime reduction, crime prevention and increased safety and security.

Cheryl Chapman, Senior Consultant at the South East LHIN for the areas of Primary Health Care, Health Links, and Chronic Disease Prevention and Management

Cheryl is an experienced health care leader, quality specialist, nurse and educator who has worked in all healthcare sectors. 
Barry Freeburn, Staff Sergeant, Ontario Provincial Police Prince Edward County Detachment
