ACE Inhibitor (ends in "pril")		Lowers blood pressure and
Perindopril (Coversyl)		decreases the strain on the heart
Ramipril (Altace)		
Anti-platelet agents		Lowers the risk of blood clot
ASA (Aspirin)		formation, especially after heart
Clopidogrel (Plavix)		attack, bypass, stents
Ticagrelor (Brilinta)		
ARB (ends in "sartan")		Works like the ACE inhibitors,
Candesartan (Atacand)		but doesn't cause an annoying
Losartan (Cozaar)		cough
Valsartan (Diovan)		
Beta Blocker (ends in "lol")		Lowers blood pressure,
Bisoprolol		decreases strain on the heart
Carvedilol		and slows down heart rate

Bood Thinner or anticoagulant		Lowers the risk of blood clot
Warfarin		formation, especially if you have
Apixaban (Eliquis)		atrial fibrillation

Calcium channel blocker		Lowers blood pressure,
Amlodipine (Norvasc)		decreases strain on the heart
Diltiazem (Cardizem/Tiazac)		and helps prevent angina

Diuretic		Decreases blood pressure and
Furosemide		fluid retention by getting rid of
Hydrochlorothiazide		excess water. Also called a
Spironolactone		"water pill"
Nitrates		Relaxes blood vessels and
Nitroglycerin patch		increases blood supply to the
Nitroglycerin spray		heart. Used for chest pain
Statin		Lowers the level of cholesterol in
Atorvastatin (Lipitor)		the body by stopping your own
Rosuvastatin (Crestor)		production of it

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
